#### **ZERO TOLERANCE OFFENSES**

The following violations occurring on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event will result in a suspension of at least one calendar year.

- 1. Possession of a Firearm, Explosive or Incendiary, or Poison Gas device
- 2. Striking a School Employee or School Resource Officer
- 3. Unlawfully possessing any controlled substance or drug

#### CELL PHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

- Cell phones should be turned off/silent during the school day. Any electronic device, including cell phones, that is seen whether being used or not, will be confiscated and turned in to the Welcome Center (Ms. Scott).
- 2. Should a student become disagreeable, uncooperative or belligerent, the device may be confiscated for the school year. Confiscation is in accordance with the TENNESSEE STATE LAW, TCA 49-6-4214.
- 3. Cell Phone Confiscation Time Periods:

1<sup>st</sup> Offense: If a parent is unable to pick up the phone, school holds for three days

2<sup>nd</sup> Offense: Refer to COAB
3<sup>rd</sup> Offense: Refer to COAB
4<sup>th</sup> - 10<sup>th</sup> Offense: Refer to COAB

#### **TARDY POLICY**

It is imperative that your child is at school everyday by 7:00am to hear important announcements and report to 1st block on time. Students must report timely to each block to avoid loss of instructional time. It is our mission to serve our students for the full 7.5 hours each day so that we may better prepare them for high school, college and/or career.

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Tardy 30-minute detention (Parent Phone Call for approval)
- 4<sup>th</sup> Tardy 1-hour detention (Parent Phone Call for approval)
- 5<sup>th</sup> Tardy Referral to grade level administrator

#### STUDENT DRESS CODE - MUST BE IN DRESS CODE ONCE IN THE BUILDING

The OKMS dress code encourages an atmosphere of order, discipline, and safety which is essential to providing quality education. Dress and grooming must be modest, clean, and decent, not seeking to draw attention to the individual, and not distracting from learning. It is the student's and parent's/guardian's responsibility to ensure that students arrive at school in compliance with the dress code.

#### **SHIRTS**

- 6th grade Solid Black polo collared shirts or approved OKMS T-Shirt
- 7th Grade Solid Gold/Yellow polo style collared shirts or approved OKMS T-Shirt
- 8th Grade Solid White/Gray polo style collared shirts or approved OKMS T-Shirt
- \* Shirts must be worn tucked into bottoms
- \* Print or logo on shirts restricted to credit card-size brand name or logo
- \* **Prohibited:** Hoodies, shirts that are too tight, too short to cover midriff, or revealing of cleavage

#### **SLACKS/PANTS**

- Khaki or black chino/docker style pants (no denim), knee-length shorts may be worn
- Pants must be worn at the waist (no sagging)
- Slacks/pants to be in good repair; no frayed edges, holes, appearance of holes, rips, or tears
- \* **Prohibited:** Dresses, skirts, jeans, nylon wind suits, sweat pants, overalls, jogging pants, jeggings, leggings, tights, pajama pants, etc

#### **BELTS/HEADBANDS**

- Belts must be black, brown (standard belt color), yellow, clear, or white only
- Headbands must be black, brown, yellow, clear, or white, elastic, and solid in color

#### SHOES/SOCKS

- Athletic or casual dress shoes only
- Only closed-toe shoes and shoes with a strap around the ankle are allowed at school
- The only sock colors worn at OKMS are black, yellow, and white. No Exceptions
- \* **Prohibited:** Crocs, Skele-Toes, houseshoes, slippers, open-toed shoes, flip-flops, sandals, slides, etc.

#### **OUTERWEAR**

- Sweaters worn during the school day must be the same color as the grade level polo color.
   All other jackets, sweaters, hoodies, coats, vests, purses/bags, backpacks, etc. must be placed in lockers
- Logos on shirts are restricted to credit card-sized brand name or logo
- **Prohibited:** No hoods are to be on the head at any time when in the building; No hoodies are allowed to be worn.
- Non-dress-code outerwear may be confiscated and returned at the end of the school day

#### **ACCESSORIES**

- Prohibited: hats, headwear, hoodies, bonnets, scarves/bandannas, sunglasses, do-rags, gloves, beads, beaded attire, items displaying illegal/contraband, and blankets
- \* In matters of opinion, the school administrators' decision will prevail.

#### **NEVER ALLOWED**

 Clothing or accessories that identify students belonging to or affiliated with a non school-sponsored group, display contraband, or any attire/accessory that causes a distraction to the learning environment.

#### <u>Hallway</u>
